

Deep learning closure models for large-eddy simulation

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Abstract

We model the unclosed terms in the large-eddy simulation (LES) equation using a deep neural network, with parameters selected to minimize the difference between the LES solution and corresponding filtered Direct Numerical Simulation (DNS) training data. A key feature is that the optimization is over the entire PDE (whose solution is a function of the neural network), which is numerically challenging. We develop a computationally efficient optimization method using the adjoint PDEs and their dual-consistent finite-difference scheme. With such a formulation, in addition to modeling the closure terms, the training algorithm corrects for numerical error (which can be substantial in LES). Our adjoint PDE training algorithm is parallelized using a multi-GPU framework. The deep learning LES models are evaluated on several decaying isotropic turbulence and turbulent jet configurations. In out-of-sample comparisons, the deep learning LES model outperforms the standard Smagorinsky and dynamic Smagorinsky models.
